Banquet Firearms Raffle

This year, our raffle includes 32 firearms. 16 of these firearms are reserved for law enforcement officers and 16 are reserved for 100 Club members. Our firearms dealer has done an excellent job of procuring firearms. Here's a summary of the firearms our 100 Club members are eligible to win:

- 7 pistols, including a Glock 19 "Trump 47th Victory" pistol
- 5 rifles, including a Mossberg Patriot 6.5cr
- 4 shotguns, including a Panzer Arms Bullpup G2

K-9 Patrol Vehicles for our Sheriff's Office

In 2025, your 100 Club purchased three K-9 conversion kits for three new Sheriff's Office patrol cars at a cost of \$23,487. This year, one additional conversion kit has been purchased, costing \$9,715. Upon delivery, each patrol shift will have a K-9 unit.

These kits replace the back seats and provide supplemental air conditioning, food and water, and a remotely controlled door that the deputy can use to release the dog in case of an emergency.



Patrol Car Defibrillators

Your 100 Club, together with the Nimitz Rotary Club and Create Healthy, purchased 36 Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). These cost \$2,000 each and are carried in patrol cars belonging to the Sheriff's Office, Police Department, our Texas Parks & Wildlife Game Wardens and our Cattle Ranger.

FPD Front Line Mobility Health Program

In 2025, the Fredericksburg Police Department applied for and received a VOCA grant to fund an Essentials Cardiovascular-Focused Evaluation program for all FPD officers. This was a one-time grant and 30 police officers took advantage of this program. For 2026, FPD wishes to participate in a second program entitled Essentials Cancer-Focused Evaluation. FPD anticipates 38 officers participating. Like the cardiovascular program, this is an extensive examination intended to detect early warning signs of cancer and recommend treatment and lifestyle changes.

The cancer program costs \$650 per participant and the complete cost failed to pass the City's annual budget. Your 100 Club board approved awarding \$18,000 to supplement the City's \$7,000 budget amount so the cancer-focused evaluation program may proceed.

Officer Certification and Investigator Training

Whenever an agency recruits an officer who is new to law enforcement, the officer must attend the Alamo Area Council of Governments (AACOG) Law Enforcement Academy in San Antonio to become certified. The cost of attending is \$4,000. Your 100 Club board approved scholarships for all new Sheriff's Office and Police Department recruits requiring certification.

In August this year, your 100 Club board is sponsoring two Sheriff's Office Investigators to attend the International Homicide Investigators Symposium in New Orleans and one Investigator to attend the Crimes against Children Conference in Dallas. For all three Investigators, the total sponsorship is \$4,500.
